It is fascinating to look at the world through the eyes of children. Their curiosity and zest for learning encouraged us to revisit the life of Mahatma Gandhi last month. On the eve of Gandhi Jayanti, some of our young children prepared a time line of his life and achievements. After weeks of research, they put together a 22 page scroll which they shared with their friends. While reading about this great leader, they often had

passionate discussions on his philosophy and ideals and how they are relevant to our lives.

We also had the opportunity to interact with children of other NGOs at a screening of our animated film 'Raju & I' organized by the Mohile Parikh Centre. The sensitively made film was followed by a discussion on child rights and how each one of us could do our bit towards this cause.

The children of our Igatpuri project were helped further in accessing their right to education by Tata Motors Limited. Thanks to a new school bus donated by them, these young children who live in remote hamlets will no longer have to walk long distances to reach the Education Centre. They are very excited and eagerly look forward to their daily trips. For the first time, our community in Igatpuri celebrated World Indigenous People's Day in August 2012. About 500 people assembled at Aseema's Education Centre for Tribal Children in Awalkheda, where they were sensitized about their rights.

Based on recommendations from our in-house counsellors, students and their parents will receive assistance from these specialists.

Our children went the extra mile in making Teachers' Day a truly special occasion for our dedicated team. Their thoughtful 'Thank You' cards were filled with warm wishes for their teachers. A generous buffet organized by Sahara Hospitality Ltd. accompanied by entertaining performances by teachers added a sparkle to the celebrations.

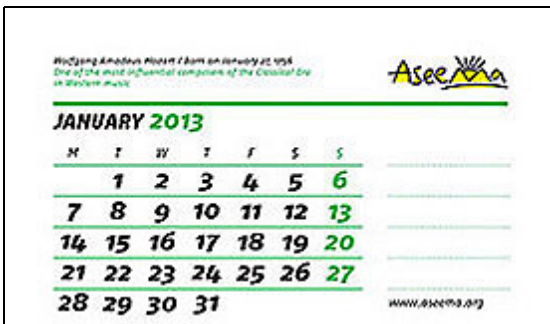
